

Funeral Services.

The funeral services over the remains of little Mabel Elizabeth, the daughter of Merlin J. and Marie Stone, were held in the Mound Fort hall, Sunday, April 9th, 1899.

At 1:30 o'clock the cortege formed at the residence and, after short prayer, the remains were placed in the hearse and escorted to the hall.

The pall bearers were: Ambrose A. and Ernest Shaw, Amos C. and Lewis Stone, Walter Parry and Jesse Moore, cousins of deceased.

Fifteen little girls—Mabel's playmates—occupied reserved seats near the casket, which was covered with flowers.

Words of consolation and comfort to the bereaved were spoken by Bishop J. M. Ferrin, Elders Dudley Stone and John Barker. The services were concluded by prayer and the large cortege re-formed and followed the remains to the Ogden City cemetery.
